They hit it off and promised to write each other when they got home.

Lorene wrote in January, "Having 3 surgeries in one year is plain just <u>not fun!</u>" Malinda responded in February, "I am walking with a limp and pain, but I'm trying to cure that with stretchers. I don't use wheelchair much but still some."

What began as a friendship between two Amish girls grew to be a "circle" of letters now in its second year, among seven girls, ranging in ages 13 to 17, and living in WI (3), MI (2), IN (1), and OH (1). Dora from WI wrote, "Lorene, we all thought it was really something how many surgeries etc. you had to go thru already. Almost can't realize how nice we do indeed have it. Or how very minor problems I've got. Thinking of you!" Edna wrote from WI, "Greetings of much love sent to each of you! Wonder how these lines find you all. Hopefully good & not too mischievous!" Lovine wrote from WI, "This week is much full of planting flowers besides taking care of sick ones." Edna wrote a fitting summary: "I hope your all on the better side. It would be exciting if we could all be at Shriner's. That would be fun."

A whole new dimension of "caring" emerges from the fine literary endeavors of these seven patients across the miles, drawn together by a common heritage and their mutual experiences at SHC - Chicago. We are delighted to share them with you, through the kindness of James Lambright, Lorene's father, who participated in an Amish fundraiser in Shipshewana, IN a few years back in which the Amish made pizzas and sold, with the assistance of Shrine van drivers, to other Amish families throughout LaGrange County.
