The 4th Annual Irma and Larry Sturm Memorial Ethics Lecture, held on July 21, 2016, featured Lisa Anderson-Shaw, DrPH, speaking on "Pediatric Clinical Ethics Consultation: Caring for the Most Vulnerable." Participants engaged in a lively discussion on a variety of issues facing our pediatric families and medical staff, including how to address treatment when disagreement occurs between the pediatric patient and parent regarding the treatment plan, and recommendations for when parents ask the medical team not to disclose the diagnosis and/or prognosis to the pediatric patient.

Dr. Anderson-Shaw currently serves as director of the Clinical Ethics Consult Service at the University of Illinois Medical Center (UIMC) in

Chicago. Dr. Anderson-Shaw is a licensed and board certified Advance Practice Nurse in the state of Illinois, with over 30 years of nursing experience. She has been published extensively, including the *Journal of Medical Ethics*, the *Journal of Clinical Ethics*, and *Ethics & Regulation*. She is on the editorial board for *CHART – Journal of Nursing in Illinois* and reviews for several academic journals.
