Tripoli's Donor Development Director Gerald Arnholt reports that leaders from Harley-Davison, Miller-Coors Brewing, Potawatomi Casino, and Aurora Health Care have been invited to join Tripoli Potentate Doug Winter, Recorder Jim Christie, SHC - Chicago Board member Bob Manders, and Tripoli Nobles to the event, which will run from 4:30 PM until 8 PM, at Tripoli, 3000 W. Wisconsin Ave., Milwaukee.
