In past years, children needing treatment with orthotics (brace) or prosthetics (artificial limb) were directed to one of several private providers near our hospital for care. From these private vendors, children received the world-class assistance, which has been the trademark of all pediatric care for more than 90 years in Chicago.

It gives us great pleasure to announce that, in August 2016, SHC - Chicago began providing orthotic and prosthetic (O & P) services here at the hospital. We have established *Pediatric Orthotic and Prosthetic Services* (POPS), a premier operation, now a part of available care for our patients. The team, right, is our POPS staff, whose extraordinary professional skills create customized devices for each child's specific need. Our POPS lab provides the latest treatment and fabrication processes, utilizing 3D scanning and computer-aided design to create custom devices. Our orthotic and prosthetic specialists design braces, artificial limbs, and adaptive devices to improve function and mobility, reduce pain and give children the ability to live life more independently. The fitting room and work area for orthotics and prosthetics are adjacent to the outpatient clinic. The manager of POPS, Bill Craggs, certified prosthetist-orthotist (CPO), is already familiar to families as he was a representative here from Dreher Orthotics and Prosthetics for many years.

We are delighted to have this remarkable service and these fine professionals as part of the excellent care of children here at Shriners Chicago.
